Tenant Reminders:

Fires:

Whilst fires are permitted on most sites, please remember that burning is a last resort and should be done considerately, so not to cause nuisance to surrounding areas. Tenants can be fined if found causing a nuisance.

Cockerels:



Under the Allotments Act 1950, cockerels are not permitted on allotments due to the noise nuisance they create. Cockerels need to be removed as soon as possible. Now that the Avian Influenza restrictions have lifted, this should be easier to do.

Socialisina:

Whilst we want the allotments to be a happy, sociable community, we expect tenants not to use plots for socializing purposes, i.e. evening drinking parties. Allotments are for cultivating only and should only be occupied during daylight hours, unless feeding livestock or in the event of an emergency.

All of these issues are covered by your Tenancy Agreement and the Allotment Rules. Tenants found not adhering to these will be removed from the site.

Society and Tenant / Shareholder Forums

As discussed in the AGM, we will be holding society and tenant / shareholder forums to discuss with attendees any queries or information they need regarding their site or the Alliance. These will be in person but may also be attended online by Zoom. Dates and more details to follow.



NAS Membership

The National Allotment Society National Society of Allotment and Leisure Gardeners Ltd All shareholders were given an opportunity to join the NAS membership scheme, funded by the RAA, when rent letters were sent out in December 2021. If you did not

Benefits of being in the scheme include a discounted seed scheme and plot-holder insurance. If you are a society site and not already a member, please consider joining. Improvement Works

We are still waiting for dates from contractors for planned works to be carried out on sites. If



you have a small project to do on a society-managed site, the Alliance has a small budget to be able to match-fund these – please contact our Allotment Support Assistant for more details. We can also look at helping to source external funding for projects such as making plots accessible. Clifton Site recently applied for funding which allowed them to create a plot for Caremark who support people with complex health conditions to



enable them to live a full and active ordinary life in their own community and home. This included raised beds and suitable accessible ground coverings.

Pest Control

Those sites that were included in the pest control provision will now be aware that the service is being done in-house and not by RMBC. The decision for this was to make it more cost-effective and to be able to offer provision to more sites. We gave society sites an opportunity for a representative to train to become qualified to distribute the pest control on their site. This may also be rolled out on direct-managed sites in the future. The Alliance has provided sites with bait boxes, snap traps and poison. If your site is currently experiencing a prolific pest control problem, please contact the

Alliance to discuss the option of getting someone trained up.

Director Vacancies
